

**Advanced Payment and Care Model (APCM) Learning Session:

**Why:** We'll be building on our last three FTF APCM gatherings: interviewing around SDoH, learning about client perspectives on health and wellbeing, developing empathy and stronger partnerships in a non-triggering environment, and ways to expand visit types and care teams to provide more human-centric health experience within and outside your health center. During this learning session, we will continue to look at using data to understand subpopulations of focus and include community partnerships and solutions in your intervention design efforts. To help health centers meet their goals in forming successful community partnerships in response to learning about subpopulation needs, we want to:

1. Continue on sub-population work using disaggregated data, start considering an intervention design/experiment that includes an associated community partner and/or community solution.
2. Learn more about CHC role within community health context and scope of partnerships as it relates to emerging data, 'pie' team formation (graph reflective of drivers of health and wellbeing where medical care occupies 10-20%), and SDoH interventions (with specific focus on food, legal, housing, and education)
3. Gain familiarity on empathic interviewing around social issues, operationalization, and innovative approaches towards achieving effective CHC community partnerships within experimental constructs and with an eye towards spread
4. Lay paving stones for November's focus on interventions that respond to the social determinants of health, and continual focus on your selected sub-populations of focus.
