This initiative is intended to enhance health centers' capabilities to recruit, develop, and retain their workforce by exposing health and allied health professions students, trainees, and residents to education and training programs at health centers. The first step to participate in the initiative is to complete an assessment of your health center's readiness to engage in health professions training programs. Individualized Health Center Recruitment and Retention Data Profile Dashboards: The [STAR² Center](#), a project of the [Association of the Clinicians of the Underserved](#), has created individual health center recruitment and retention Data Profile Dashboards. The profiles can help you analyze your own data as it relates to recruitment and retention and compare data to that reported to all health centers nationally. The Data Profile Dashboard is meant to spark a self-assessment that can help health centers determine where changes could be made to improve workforce recruitment and retention.
